Copyright protects your work and stops others from using it without your permission. Copyright automatically applies when you create original literary and non-literary works such as books, movies, videos, pictures, songs, music and software. If someone copies work without permission, the owner may take legal action.

<u>Creative Commons</u> provides free, easy-to-use copyright licenses to make a simple and standardised way to give the public permission to share and use your creative work. Creative Commons licenses provide an easy way to manage the copyright terms that attach automatically to all creative material under copyright and allows a creator to apply certain conditions of use.

You can use the <u>Creative Commons chooser</u> to select the appropriate license for your work.

Please ensure that you own the rights to any music, sound, image or video content used in your entry. You should obtain the necessary permissions or right to use prior to entry and be able to evidence this if challenged. Entries that do not have the necessary rights cannot be accepted.

Please note:

Films containing illegally downloaded content (such as music, images and video) cannot be accepted.

Please be aware that the use of illegal file sharing sites and services is dangerous, and that illegal downloading breaks the law.
