

## Welsh in English-medium education: Professional learning and support

Welsh language and culture is one of the overarching values and dispositions in the [professional standards for teaching and leadership](#).

Practitioners need to be supported to develop their Welsh language skills, language teaching methodology and their confidence, so that in turn they can support learners' spontaneous communication in Welsh through responsive teaching.
